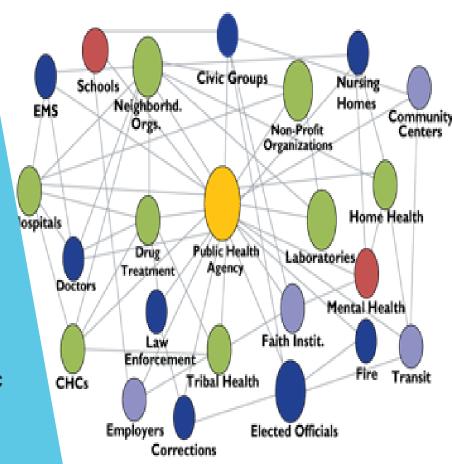

HISTORY: STRESS AND TRAUMA ARE PUBLIC HEALTH ISSUES

- Stress linked to 6 leading causes of death
 - Heart disease, cancer, lung ailments, accidents, cirrhosis of the liver, and suicide
- Trauma impacts more than just the individual
 - Ripple effect to others –
 - Some communities disproportionately affected
 - Oppression + Poverty + Trauma = Toxic
- Intergenerational transmission of trauma
- Systemic, preventative approachneeded

Trauma is not an ACE

Results from an **event or series of events** that are **physically or emotionally harmful** and have **lasting adverse effects** on wellbeing

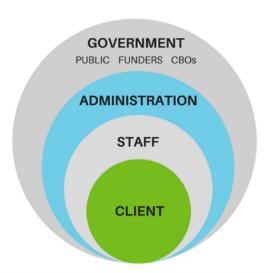
