

Discontinuation of the LTSS Alternative Payment Model

Q: Why is the Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS) Alternative Payment Model (APM) being discontinued?

A: The pilot project for the LTSS APM is not being continued due to the unavailability of earmarked federal funding, making the model financially unsustainable beyond the pilot project phase.

Q: When is the LTSS APM pilot project scheduled to end?

A: The pilot project will end on Jun 30, 2024. It has been extended beyond its original end date to align with the State's fiscal year.

Q: Who has been informed about the discontinuation of the LTSS APM?

A: The notice was emailed to home health care providers participating in the pilot program.

Q: What should participating providers do?

A: Participating providers must submit their final report to Neighborhood reflecting Q2 2024 by the July 15, 2024 deadline.
