



Alcohol and Other Drug Dependence: Initiation and Engagement in Treatment

## How You Can Help

If your patient has a SUD, it's essential for them to begin treatment with a substance abuse provider <u>within 14</u> <u>days</u> of their diagnosis and have <u>two</u> <u>additional visits within the 34 days</u> <u>after their first visit</u>.

You also can provide support by:

- Encouraging them to accept their treatment plan
- Anticipating resistance and having ideas to overcome it
- Helping them identify challenges to receiving care
- Asking them to engage their family for support
- Following up regularly to make sure they're staying on track

We appreciate you taking an active role in screening your patients ages 13 and older for substance abuse disorder (SUD).

The National Institute on Drug Abuse and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration recommend following the Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) guideline at https://www.samsha.gov/sbirt.
